

Solutions: Housing Affordable to Those in Deep Poverty, Services to Access Housing Stability

Rapid Re-Housing

Housing search assistance

People w/o Barriers

Families,

Most

- Assistance with security deposits, back utility payments, etc.
- Rental assistance for 3-24 months, but no limit on length of stay
- Short-term case management





Supportive Housing

- Long-term rental assistance
- Long-term <u>voluntary</u> intensive case management to—
 - Promote housing stability (working with landlords to avoid eviction, money management training, etc.)
 - Coordinate care

Emergence of Housing First























Housing is necessary for recovery from physical, mental health, substance use conditions. Homeless people must be linked to housed first, before services effectively improve health.

Services must be face-to-face, offered where the person lives, and designed to help maintain housing stability, prevent eviction, address behavior.

Tenant participation in services is voluntary: Housing is not contingent on compliance, or discontinued when client uses drugs/alcohol.



Legislative Solutions Considered this Year: Bills

AB 2821, the Medi-Cal Housing Bill:

Would Create a Rental Assistance Program for Homeless People Through Grants to Counties, Linked to Whole Person Care & Health Home Program Services (Collaboration between HCD & DHCS)

Also in Assembly Housing Budget



"By Right" Trailer Bill:

Any Housing Developer Could Build "By Right" if Project Includes 5% for Moderate Income Households

SB 1380, the Housing First Bill:

Would Require All Housing Programs California Funds with Intent to Address Homelessness to Follow "Housing First" Elements. Would Also Create an Inter-Agency Coordinating Council on Homelessness.
